

# Berardi Defends Annapolis Title

ANNAPOLIS, MD--Maryland's Premier Ten Mile Race, better known as the Annapolis Ten Miler, was contested on Sunday, August 27th. The Annapolis Striders should be commended for their efforts of pulling together the right sponsors to bring an outstanding running event to the running community. The uncontrollable factor was the weather which held high 70 degrees and high humidity. To some runners this event is used to gauge their level of conditioning. The event posted about 2,900 finishers.

The runners had an excellent send off from the Navy-Marine Corps Memorial Stadium and the next three miles took the runners to the gates of the U.S. Naval Academy. The next two miles, the runners had a chance to position themselves and to make up lost time. As the runners departed the Academy it was time for the serious part of the course after the five mile mark where they were greeted by the first hill. The rolling hills were positioned between miles 6 1/2 and 8. The last mile was the time to pull it all together since there were no hills.

The men's field saw the return of some former winners. The challenge of the first place with 50:34. Second was taken by Steve Kartalia of Westminster with 51:28. Third went to Mike Regan of Washington, DC 52:34. Jim Hage of Lanham, was fourth with a 52:52. In

fifth position was taken by James Clelland of Baltimore in 53:04.

The third time proved to be a charm for Donna Elliot of Annandale, VA. In 1987 Elliot clocked a 1:06:16 and in 1988 she finished third with 1:02:55. The determination paid off as Elliot clocked a 1:00:32 for first place (92nd overall). Only seconds behind was Rose Malloy of Crownsville, MD with 1:00:43 (97th overall). Third went to Brenda Walter of Memphis, TN with a 1:01:12 (104th overall). The fourth position went to Cathy Ventura-Merkel of Arlington, VA with 1:01:33 (112th overall). Denise Knickman of Chevy Chase finished fifth with a 1:03:09 (167th overall). Sixth women was Patty McGovern of Arlington, VA with 1:03:12 (169th overall). McGovern was no stranger to this course. She took first place in 1988 with 58:56 and 58:11 in 1984 for first place.

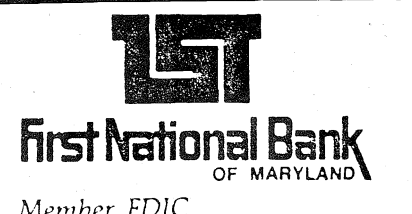
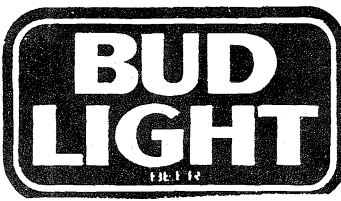

AND MORE HILLS**

BATESVILLE, VA--If you like hills, miles and miles of hills that mostly go up and up, then the Batesville Day 10K is your race. The event held May 27th is one of the oldest and most definitely one of the toughest 10K's in Virginia. Tradition dictates the course follows rural roads along the orchard-covered foothills of the Blue Ridge Mountains. Warmer than usual weather highlighted the event. Elevated humidity added a touch of mid-summer as only 59 brave souls ran past Page's General Store at the start.

Anyone who breaks 40 minutes should receive a crown of mountain goat horns as a reward and this year I accomplished the feat as Bill Guerrant, 38, polished off some fine runners to win in 35:04. After the race Guerrant disclosed his uphill racing secret. "I just kept my head down and counted dead birds as I climbed. By the time I reached 1,001, the tough part was over." Five masters (40+ years) finished in the top eleven. Pete Runge, 18, finished second with a 36:56 while Kerry Gardner, 41, ran a personal course PR by two minutes for third overall and first Masters in 37:42. Grand Masters Tony Gee, 52, prepping for World Veterans' Championship in August also ran a course personal best good for eighth overall in 39:35.

Amy O'Leary, 32, led all women with a most impressive 41:25 and 15th overall. Finishing second, just two hills back, was Frances Hatch, 26, 46:38 and masters Connie Behrens was third with a 49:30.
